Today Feliciane and his wife, Hilds, live in a \$60,000 house in Greenwich County Colifornia. in a \$60,000 house in Orange County, California.

Yokohama is Japan's principle port for trade and commerce. It has grown from a small fishing village to a modern metropolis in less than 200 years.

Despite its extraordinary growth, Yokohama has had its share of disaster. The great earthquake of 1923 almost completely demolished the entire city. came World War II, when bombs leveled the city. Today, though, Yokohama has been rebuilt and is bigger and better than ever.

Some of Yokohama's famous spots include the foreigners cemetery, which is the burial place of people from all over the world. The Silk Center not only has an extremely interesting and comprehensive display sponsored by Japan's silk industry but also has an excellent shopping arcade which offers a large variety of Japanese

products.

Another attraction is the historic New Grand Hotel, only a block or two from the Silk Center. It was the first "Western style" hotel ever built in Japan. At the top of the New Grand there is a fabulous restaurant with outstanding service. down the street from the New Grand is Yokohama's famous Marine Tower. On a clear day, one can see Mt. Fuji from the top of the Tower, along with the large bay and industrial complex on its edge.

Some of the best shapping places include Motomachi and Isezakicho Streets. Motomachi Street is where Yokohama had its beginnings. The prices on Motomachi are generally quite reasonable. Isezakicho, stretching for eight blocks right in the heart of the city, has some of the best

specialty shops in all Japan.

Laste but not leaste is Yokohama's Chinatown, located directly behind the New Grand Hotel. It is not too impressive by day, but at night it becomes a showcase of dazzling neon lights with countless color- of pray for some sunshine this weekend! 
