

### SON OF LIBERTY

Last week at the Student Council assembly, Mr. Spaulding said something that bothered us a bit. He claimed that some of the cendidates did not meet the requirements for office. He said that two of these requirements were a certain grade average and a certain year in school for certain offices. There's nothing wrong with these requirements. They are stated in the constitution. I But then he went on to say that if we, the student body, voted for certain candidates and these candidates were elected, then, we, the student body,

were smending the constitution.

But Article XI of the constitution of the Student Council, Nile C. Kinnick High School, says something else: "The constitution may be emended by a majority vote of the entire student body, provided that the amendment has been first approved by the Student Council, the Student Council advisor, and the principal. The proposed amendment must be read at two regular Student Council meetings. The vote shall be taken following the second reading in the Student Council after which the proposed amendment shall be submitted to the student body," In other words, there is a formal way of amending our constitution. Not the way we were supposedly doing it.

Then, to add insult to injury, we weren't even told which candidates didn't meet the recuirements. We couldn't reject the person even if we wanted to, because we didn't know who they

We, the student body, shouldn't have to sit back and take what the administration dictates. The President of the United States cannot amend the constitution of the United States of America just because he wants to. There is a certain form that the President must follow; he just doesn't have that kind of power. The whole amend-est garbage can. ment was a farce. We were all trapped! We were misled to think that we could change the constitution by just a "sideline election." Even if we were to change it formally as the constitution of the Student Council states, we wouldn't have been able to vote on it, because at that time, there was no Student Council to approve of it (Article XI; Section 1 of the Constitution).

Also it's just one big farce that the constitution provides for a principal and a separate Student Council adviser, but in reality, our principal is our Student Council adviser. We, the student body, must learn to point out when and how our rights are being abused and do something about it!

Read, Heed

This year Yo-Hi will be a school of many changes. The greatest of these is of course the move to Yokosuka. This will involve many administrative policy alterations. With the whole-hearted backing of the student body, our Student Council can give the students a strong and forceful position in tailoring these policies for the benefit of the students.

You have shown your choices for people to lead you. Now they deserve your involvement and interest in them. The effectiveness of the Council will depend on the support and cooperation given them by the student body. By answering their requests and abiding by their agreements you can expect them to represent you.

If their ideas consistenly run contrary to the desires of the students, their bargaining position with the administration will be severely damaged. If you do not support them, they cannot support you. Given your interest and cooperation, this will he a year of good changes, for you.
