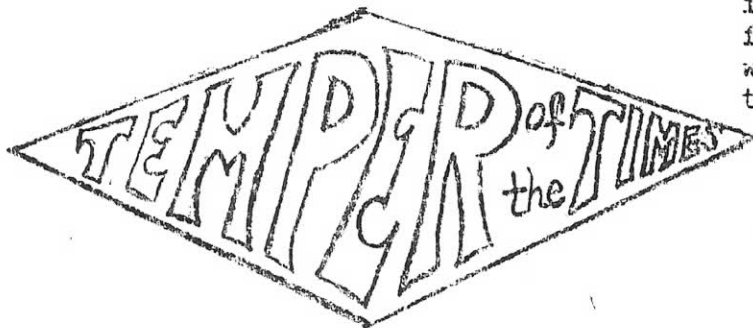
Yokosuka is a bummer

# Cycle Scene



This week's cycle is the Kawasaki 750 three. In the U.S. they call it Mach IV. The performance is wonderful and is made heavier so it won't pop wheelies like the Mach III 500.

It has new instruments like the disc-brake and a tail up design. The acceleration of the bike in quarter mile is 12 seconds flat. This is one of the fastest bikes in the world. The colors of the bikes out so far are gold and blue. The ignition is kick. (That's one thing wrong because when it's cold outside you'll probably have a hassle "kicking" it.)

The top speed of the bike is approximately 220 km. This bike is the second 3 cylinder built by the Kawaski Factory. The price is about ¥ 419,000.

If you have a bike why not go to Sagami Lake? It's about a forty-five minute ride from Camp Zama. If the traffic is heavy it will take about an hour. You can rent a motorboat there, also a rowboat. There are all sorts of motorboats ranging from five horsepower thru 30 horsepower. The 25 horsepower is probably best because the price is convenient and it's kind of fast. The price for borrowing the motorboat is 2000 yen for thirty minutes. Only two can board it. Guys who have girls and don't have money, rent a rowboat. They cost 300 yen for one hour. If you borrow for two hours with your gal you will probably have a nice romantic trip. The other ride on the lake is the ferry boat. The prices for ferries are 150 yen for children and 250 for adults. The scenery is beautiful and also the air is fresh. Try Sagami Lake.

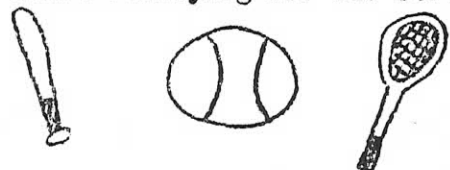

## Happenings at the Winter Olympics



When the torch was lit in Greece to commence the Olympic Games, a "Truce of God" was declared between the Grecian states so that athletes from every state might come to compete without having to fear capture or attack. For the Greeks, the Olympic Games were more than a sporting exhibition or a test of skill and strength. The Greeks felt the Games were a show of strength on the part of the entire state.

The famous torch lighting ceremony was re-enacted yesterday, centuries after the original one in Greece. The place of the ceremonies was not in the warm, sunny European country of Greece but was in the cold, snow-covered city of Sapporo, located in the northern most island of Japan, called Hokkaido.

The Olympic Games are held every four years and there are actually two parts to the games: The Summer Olympics held in August and the Winter Olympics held every February of the "Olympic year." In the U.S. the Winter Olympics isn't as widely advertised as the summer games because the United States doesn't come close to dominating the winter events as she does the summer games. Usually the Winter Olympics are dominated by the athletes from France, Germany and Switzerland.

This year in Sapporo, the athletes are competing for medals in the following events: skiing, skating, ice hockey, biathlon (a combination of events), bobsleigh and luge.

From the U.S. team, medal hopefuls for the various events are: skiing—Linda, Marilyn and Bob Cochran, Skating—Janet Lynn, Dorothy Hanill and Julie Holmes.

For those of you that might get a chance to go see the action at Sapporo, be sure not to miss a trip to the famous mineral baths, and, if you keep your eyes wide open, you may be able to spot a few bears on the very young and virgin island!

## Skiing



Skiing was introduced in the United States by mid-nineteenth century Norwegian immigrants. By 1960, however, skiing was a major sport in the United States and Canada, which together had an estimated three million active skiers. There are many types of skiing. One of the most demanding skiing events requires the skier to pass through pairs of poles called gates, while traveling at top speed on a downhill course. This is called slalom racing.

Among the different types of jumps used in skiing, the terrain jump, which requires skillful manipulation of the poles, is one of the most difficult.

Rydelius will be hauled into the court tomorrow to face Judge Dougie (No-Mercy) Spaulding on the manslaughter rap.

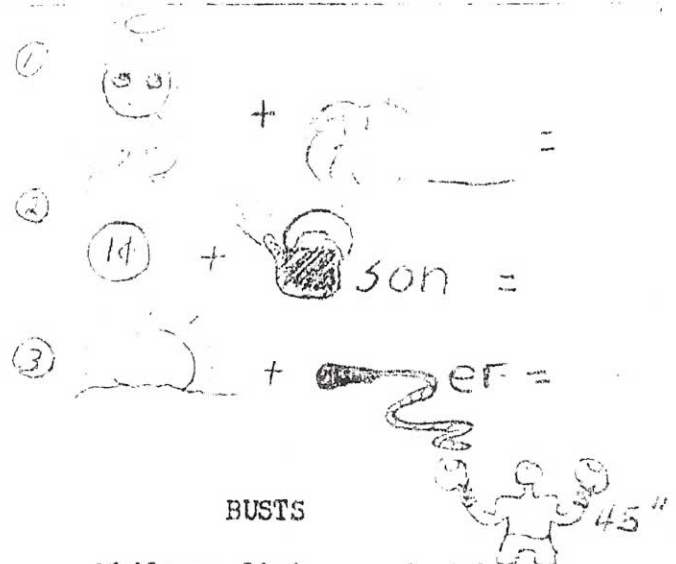

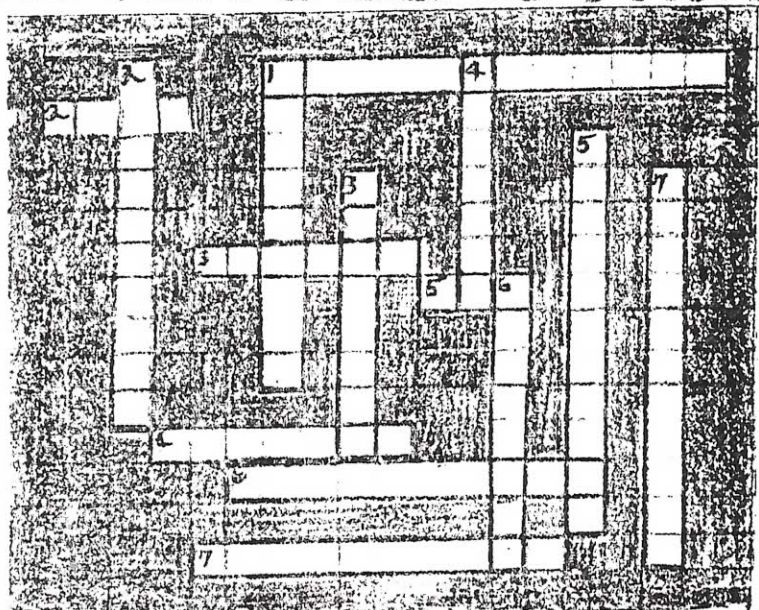
