



The rules that pertain to people who ride on school buses may be quite monotonous for they can be heard every-day especially when school is over. You can hear questions like, "Where's your bus card?" or "Who is this person?" from the bus drivers. They even ask students who have been riding on their buses from the beginning. That is the present bus situation.

The student may ride on another bus if he has a written note from his parents but it must be sensible and excusable.

When asked about the present rules on school busing, Pete-san responded that he is satisfied with the regulations because the school must be able to estimate the number of students riding to school and riding home each day.

Pete-san said, "It is usually at the last minute that students want to ride on another bus."

Going to spend the night with a friend is not grounds for permission to ride a different bus, but some cases have to be considered on their separate merits.

When asked about his reactions to the behavior of the students riding on the buses, Pete-san responded, "So far they are behaving very well, except in a few cases."

Eating sandwiches, cookies, and other snacks is permitted as are sodas, juices, and other drinks. But there are limits for they are only allowed to be consumed on buses if the students do not create a mess. The care of the buses must be considered and the bus driver who has to clean it.

Four years of high school life bring about many changes. You can usually tell whether someone is an upper-classman just by the way he does or says things. Here are a few examples:

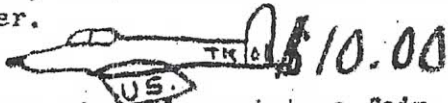
- Freshman: I'll really have to hurry to get all my homework done before the bell rings.

 Senior: The tennis shoes are alright, frosh, but you've got your T-shirt on backwards.



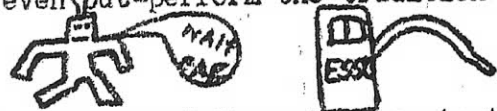
The cassette player was first introduced into the hi-fi world around 1962 as a form of a compact more convenient way of having music wherever you want it. It soon became a big hit with the audio enthusiasts as well as the music lovers.

The first line of cassettes were single channel jobs, meaning that there was just one stereo. The manufacturers of the cassette style recorders decided then why not design a stereo cassette for two channel reproduction.

The first stereo cassettes did not make as big a hit as the earlier models, since they were still being designed mainly for their compactness rather than clean sound reproductions. To make up for this, the cassette tape deck was introduced. This was a cassette recorder of similar design only it had a new range of improvements making it a standard piece of stock, greatly improved, and, in some cases, can match up to or even out-perform the traditional reel to reel recorder.

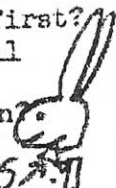

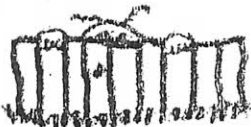

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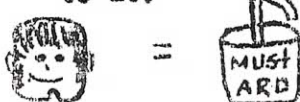

What kind of teacher gives you problems and then tells you to start when you know that there are only about two minutes left in class?

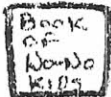
