The main reason for upping food prices is the re-valuation of the yen. Since the yen was re-valued, the Japanese workers get more money. The cafeteria can't lose money and the Japanese workers are on a set contract.

Another reason for the rise in food prices is because prices are going up in the States.

There is one thing all music has in common-it consists not only of notes, but also note sentences, which are made up of notes. These sentences in turn make up phrases or musical paragraphs which in turn make up a total composition or a movement similar to a chapter in a book.

These paragraphs say things. You have probably often times heard a song that you like but don't really know the reason why. It is almost a sense of emotion which the language of words is unable to comprehend. This is true with almost all rock music. With the exception of the lyrics, one can only understand and like the music by letting the music flow through his head and soul. The lyrics provide the listener who thinks linearly with an expression The L of emotion through the logical medium. musician thinks much differently than the The musilistener when he composed music. cian uses music as an outlet for his inhibitions-a way to express his inner

If you leve rock groups, you notice the apparent emotion that pours out when they move around the stage. This is by no means their total expression of emotion. Their expression of emotion is essentially through their music. The extremes of sound aid in their expression of emotion by enabling them to physically "feel" what is being played.

Other groups, using more conventional means of expression, depend on words to express themselves and keep their back-up music soft and simple. Still others combine the two and get something which many people think is more desirable -- a union between lyrics and music.

Three Dog Night uses the latter quite effectively in their arrangements of either softer, more wordy songs, or louder, more instrumental songs. By using this they have become very popular among almost everyone who likes music.

Emerson, Lake, & Palmer use a style different from any other-they use a style similar to that of Baroque music which is the conglomeration of quick melodic lines to form emotion. Their rock style of Baroque characteristics is very likable, and, sometimes, through the expert use of many electronic and special effects, really freaky! Their composition, "Tarkus," is a very good example of this mixing of rock and Baraque music. They do a mixed variety of other compositions, many of them humorous in both music and words.

Chicago synthesizes the American Jazz style with rock to form jazz-rock. By using horns, they are able to express themselves more freely because there are less limitations as to what sounds can be reproduced.



We hope that further assemblies will be as enjoyable.


Beethoven is a Bopper!

Do you realize just what you are doing when you adjust the volume control on your stereo set? Read this and you will have a valid reason for complaining when your parents tell you to "turn it down."

The act of reducing the volume on a given musical passage affects the mind of the listener. The music isn't at all the same as it was performed. If you are a

classical music lover (or if you parents are), you will remember the feeling that the thunder has in Beethowen's Pastoral Symphony, its feeling of presence and being, its emotional impact being so close. But move it away by reducing its intensity, and it will cause the same emotion to you as dropping a book. The same holds true for rock listeners. Turn Grand Funk down and you'll probably be rocked to sleep by its repetitions. The music was performed loud and should be reproduced loud! Try recording a real honest-to-goodness scream and then play it back at low volume. Does the scream sound like the same emotional scream that you recorded? Not really—it sounds more like a sick cat!

It does make a difference what volume level your reproductions are played at; it's a good excuse for you to keep that volume up and one less for your parents.
