On November 16, Hirohito Norikane, part of the DoDDS sponsored artist's-in-residence program, came to Kinnick High School to demonstrate some of his style and technique to Yo-Hi students and parents.

Norikane was born in 1949 and has been making prints since high school. He was educated in Tokyo at

the Sokei Art School after the decision between becoming an artist or taking up calligraphy which he says he is also good at. Norikane enjoys basing his prints mainly on blowfish, landscape, and animals. In fact, many Japanese admirers have given him the sobriquet, the blowfish artist. Many of his prints are found in such places as Hiroshima, Osaka, Texas,

and the White House.

Norikane demonstrated each step in making a print. From the sketching of the picture to the final inking of the print. After school Norikane had another show and a sale of finished prints for Kinnick parents. Prints ranged from \$10 to about \$500. The show and sale was sponsored by

Kanda's Gallery B.O.Q. Mr. Kanda, himself came to help with the demonstration and translation.

When asked what it takes to become a good artist Norikane replied, "It's a very dedicated job. You have to be prepared to put up with many changes." Norikane sleeps during the day and makes his prints at night.

## Dziedzic speaks On Hazardous Drugs

Thursday, November 29, 1984. Ms. Grasmehr called together an assembly on drug, the use and the result. After Ms. Grasmehr introduced the serious subject, Captain Walter Dziedzic was called upon to start the presentation.

"I wanted to tell you a couple of fairytales," Dziedzic announced. He said that a few weeks ago it was reported to him that a boy said that he was in Tokyo when a few Japanese guys spit a liquid at him and lit it. This was how he got burned.

Another story, told by a girl, was that she was in the honch when some Japanese guys jumped out and held her down and took her purse. While they were doing this, they burnt her with a butance lighter.

When the Jugglebugs, a professional team of jugglers made up of "Professor Confidence" and Barrett Felker, came to Yo-Hi, students couldn't help enjoying the day. After their fantastic show filled with comedy and student and teacher involvement, the Jugglebugs then gave part of their time teaching students how to juggle. Both have been traveling around the world to put on shows for about six years. Right now, they are traveling on a DODD contract to all military bases. After the Jugglebugs leave the Japan area, they plan on going to Korea.

During the assembly at Yo-Hi, they put on a wide variety of stunts. Using balls, rings, feathers, clubs, and scarves, the Jugglebugs kept the show going on smoothly and interestingly. They picked many student volunteers from the audience and even had a faculty contest for which teacher could balance a feather on his/her nose the longest.

These stories might seem tragic, but they are not true. It was discovered that what really happened was four people were in a car sniffing butance when one of the kids decided to light a lighter. The result was only minor burns, including facial ones; however, they could have died.

This was just one type of inhaling kids around Yokosuka do without even knowing the permanent consequences, which is not just a temporary high, either.

After relating the preceding information, Captain Dziedzic introduced Dr. David Holbrook, a pathologist, diagnoser of disease and examiner of bodies. He gave similar comments on drugs and inhaling; then he proceeded to his slide presentation.

The slides showed pictures of causes of asphixiation and one picture of a person dead from asphixia-

tion. There were also many slides of unhealthy organs damaged by drugs, mothballs, etc. Some examples of the organs include a burnt esophagus, destroyed bone marrow, shriveled liver, and lungs with holes.

After Dr. Holbrook's speech was over, Dziedzic again took the stand. He made clear that doing drugs and inhaling is not reversable. He then brought up the car accident that happened nearly two years ago. It had involved the sniffing of Freon.

He then showed slides of the crash to get across his point. This upset many people in the audience (see editorials, p.4)

Mrs. Grasmehr came back on stage after Dziedzic left and announced that the reason they told the students this is because "we care about you; we really do."

## Jugglebugs Entertain Yo-Hi

Professor Confidence started out the show with the "Tax Collector" and soon after Felker juggled to the music of The Lone Ranger and Ghostbusters. The stunts were followed by the clubs, scarves, and rings and volunteers. Felker's unique stunt of juggling ping pong balls with mouth caused some screams of excitement from the audience as well as Professor Confidence's stunt involving a nutritional meal being eaten and juggled simultaneously.

How did they learn to juggle? The old saying of practice makes perfect fits this answer. Professor Confidence started about seven years ago while Felker began eleven years ago. Both taught themselves in the beginning yet went to professional juggling schools later on. Even now, they practice for about one to four hours each day.

To many students working with the clubs seemed to be the hardest, though Felker stated that any stunt involving more than four objects

proves to be difficult. Although the Jugglebugs did not do any dangerous tricks during the school show, Felker has worked with both knives and fire. He simply states, "Neither of those objects are very dangerous to work with," since the knives are usually dulled and if there is no wind, fire is usually controllable as well as predictable.

There are many difficulties when juggling that people don't realize. For example, a slight wind or moving air can badly change the pattern of the object when juggling. Lighting may also cause a problem as it may blind the juggler or cause him to misjudge distance. The slope of the stage, if any, could also affect the juggler's sense of balance.

As for needing talent when learning how to juggle, patience is all that is required. Juggling is as experience where you are actually "learning how to learn." You are also learning to take chances which may help to build up your self confidence, according to Professor Confidence.

All programs must run on an Atari 800 model microcomputer in one of the following languages: Atari basic, Pascal, Microsoft basic II, Pilot or Logo. A program listing and flow-chart is required for each program.

Programs must be of original design and not copied from a similar program.

Musical and graphical programs must be accompanied by a cassette tape or printout if applicable.

The same program may not be entered in more than one age or subject category and the student may not enter more than one program for

each subject category.

All entries are final and may not be changed in category or content after the entry is made.

Finally, all programs become the property of DoDDS, Japan and may be used by the DoDDS schools in Japan.

Site winners will receive a T-shirt and a certificate, they will also be eligible to attend the final competition at Yokota. Certificates and additional prizes will be awarded to the 12 final winners at Yokota.

Two days after our school's Brain Bowl, ten Kinnick students spent a whole day competing against the best from the Kanto Plain at St. Mary's High School. A great improvement was made since last year and instead of coming out near last, the team placed seventh out of ten schools. Kinnick managed to win four rounds against Yokota, Zama, St. Maur's and St. Joseph's and tied one round against YIS. In addition to this one team member, Elizabeth Covington, made Kanto Plain All-Stars, which is an award for the top ten scorers of all the schools.

Altogether there were ten schools in the Brain Bowl, and each school had two teams. Those on Team A from our school were: Tracy Beckmann, Danny Dennehy, Diane Shreve, Jennifer Tabb, and Derek Williamson. Team B included: Cathy Begy, Elizabeth Covington, Bill Helsley, Kristen Renzelman, and Ron Toyofuku. Mrs. Oka coached the Brain Bowl team and was also a judge at the Brain Bowl.

Each school was played once where our Team A challenged their Team A and our Team B played their Team B.

There were nine rounds altogether and in each round, five games were played. In every game, 15 questions were asked and each question was worth 10 points. Bonus questions were worth 15 points (10 points for the question and 5 points for the answer).

It was in the second round when Kinnick made their first win against Yokota. The final score in that round was 90-50. Following in the fifth round, Kinnick tied YIS with a score of 80-80. The next two rounds were victories for Kinnick. Against St. Maur's the score was 85-70 and against Zama 100-50. The final victory came in the last round when Kinnick beat St. Joe's 125-60.

Of course the victors of the entire Brain Bowl was the home team — St. Mary's with a grand total of 1245. Taking second was YIS with 1040 and third was ISSH with 940. Seisen followed closely behind with 930 and then came ASIJ in fifth with 805. Yokota took sixth with a score of 760 followed by Kinnick with 720. St. Maur's took eighth with 695, Zama took ninth with 615 and St. Joseph's was last with 565.

# Dziedzic's Slides Viewed Two Ways

During the assembly in November, Capt. Dziedzic and a hospital coroner came to Yo-Hi to deliver a lecture and a slide presentation on the use of drugs. There were four explicit slides dealing with the accident occurring two years ago involving four students in the school. The students had been inhaling drugs and the car they were driving was wedged beneath a parked truck, causing excessive damage to the front end. Much controversy has been raised about these pictures.

Many people have said they saw no reason in showing such pictures, other than exploitation of the unfortunate incident. Others viewed the presentation as a distasteful rehashing of unwanted memories. They feel that they shouldn't have to see that sort of thing, that life is better and they shouldn't have to see the nasty side.

Yet some are of the opinion that

both sides should be viewed. Life does take its turning point and people should be prepared for what may happen to them or someone that is close to them. By showing those filmstrips Dziedzic was preparing students mentally for something that may very well happen. Mental preparedness can mean physical preparedness. As the French author Collette once said, we should look at all aspects of life and should stare very hard at things that are ugly. In other words, life isn't all good and people must be aware of the evil things in life.

It is hoped that showing these pictures will prevent things of this kind from happening to you. Maybe if people do stare hard at the cold ugly facts of life and realize what could happen to them, death could be prevented.

In late November, our school was visited by Captain Dziedzic and Dr. Halbrook, the pathologist from the hospital.

The purpose of their visit was to discourage students from using volatile substances.

The latter part of this assembly was presented by Captain Dziedzic, who spoke about the unfortunate car accident that occurred two years ago in our community. The accident took away the lives of two young Kinnick students, and the accident was partly the fault of the use of volatile substances.

During his talk, Dziedzic showed graphic slides of the destroyed car, showing it from many angles. I, along with many students I spoke with, thought it was unnecessary and be-
